- Much of the work was completed in house, by plant staff showcasing NRWTP's commitment to innovation, efficiency, and sustainability in membrane treatment.

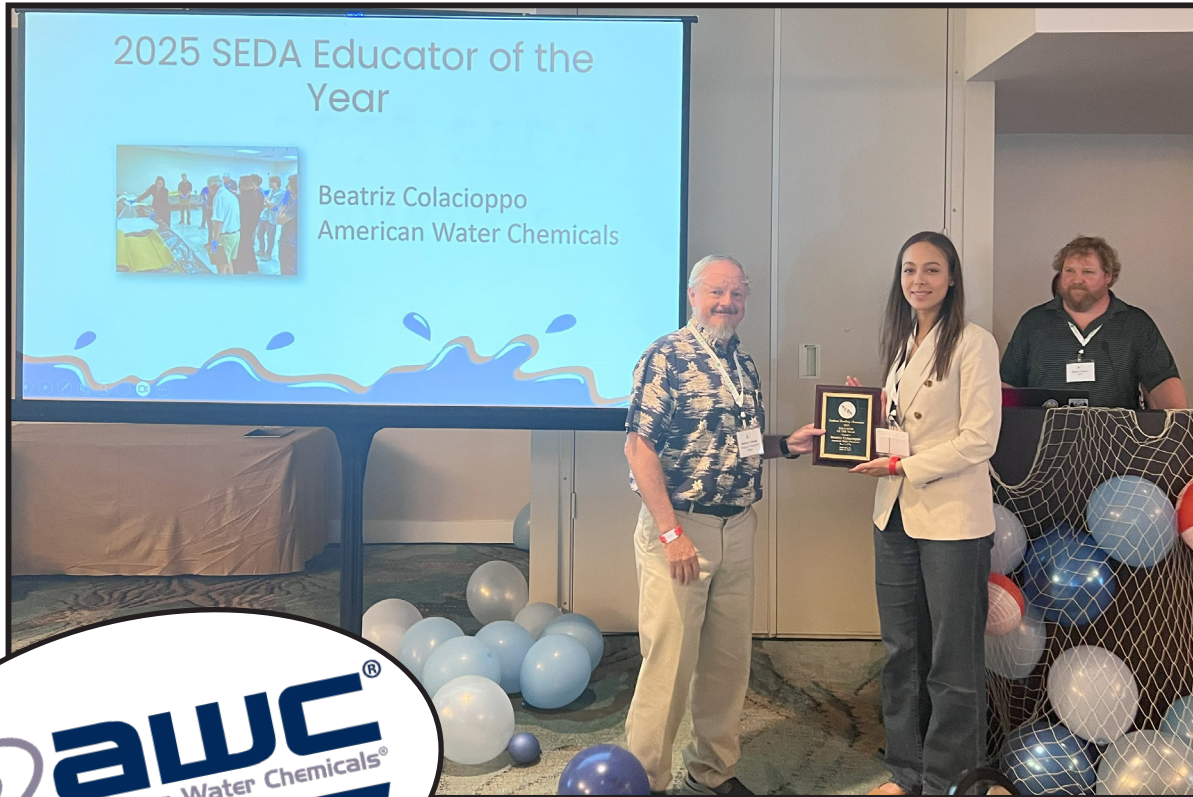

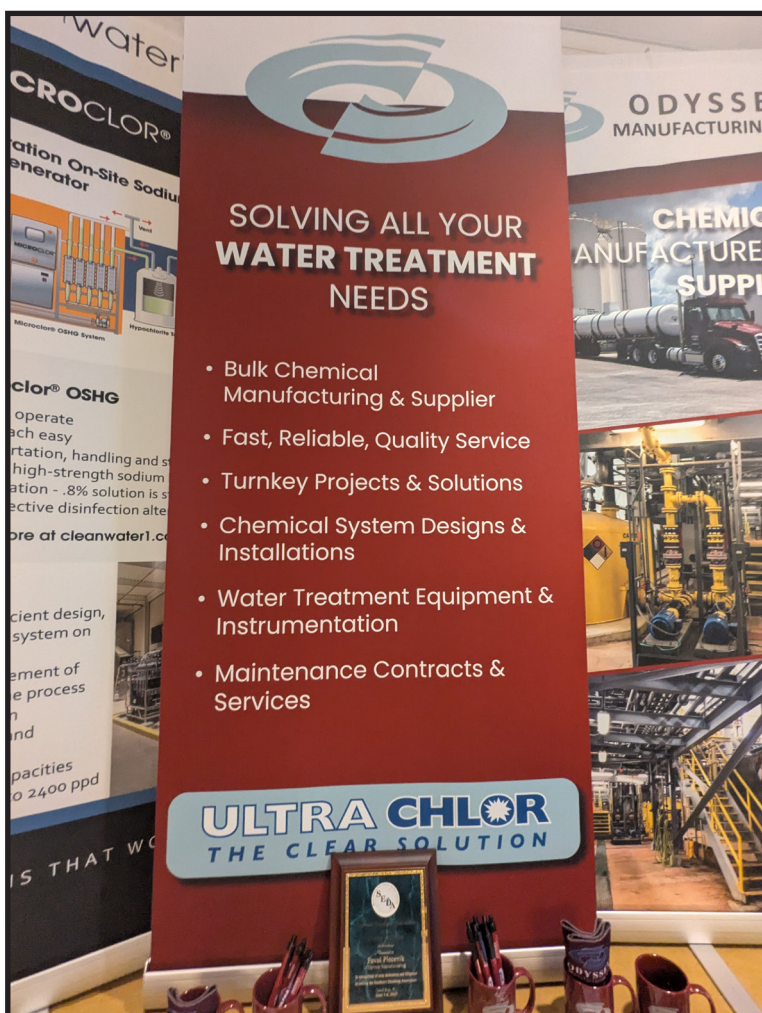
Penny Wars

SEDA founded the Membrane Operator Certification (MOC) program in the 1990’s and the committee is responsible for updating content and implementing training for operators as well as utility managers and others in the industry focused membrane treatment. The program has grown to include four different modules, each three-days in duration: I – Introduction to Membrane Systems, II – Advanced Training of NF/RO Systems, III – Advance Training of MF/UF Systems, and IV – Advance Training of MBR Systems. 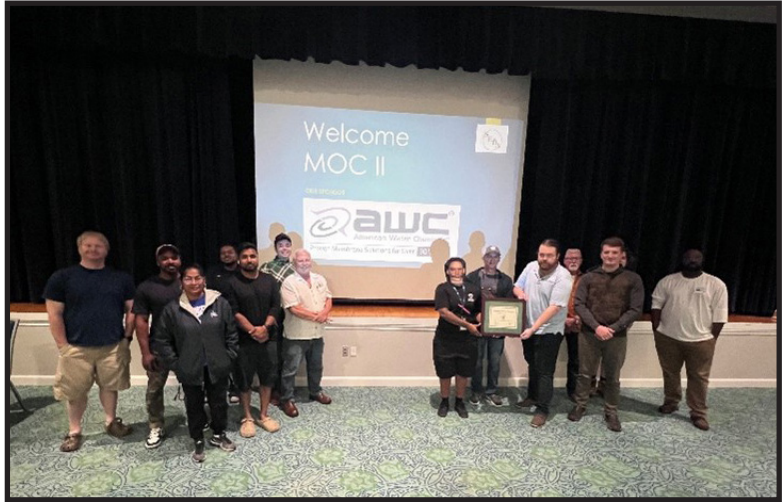
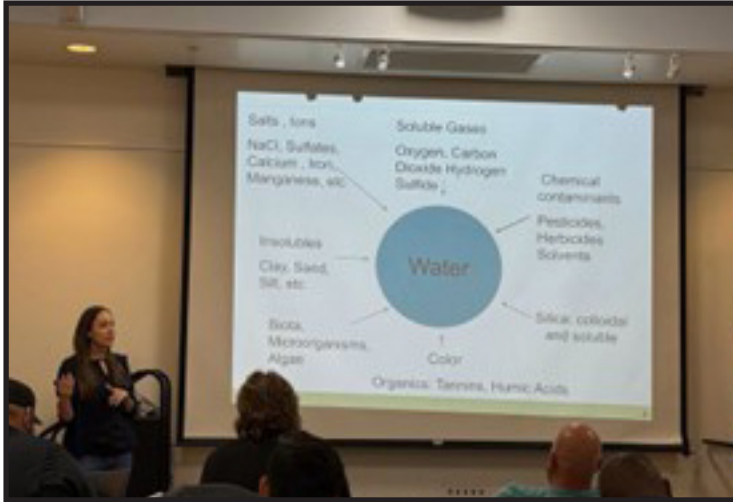

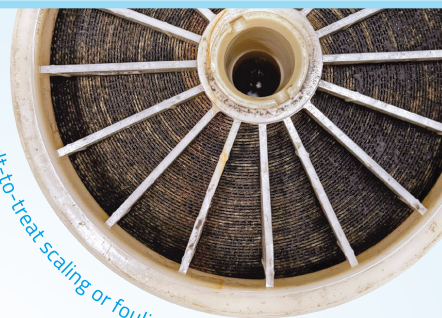
